
White: 21.9% (reflects gentrification of business district of the city since 2015)


Black/African American: 42.4%

Symptomatic Parent

- 25 year old single mother
- Non-English speaking

- Non-English speaking
 History of intimate partner violence
 Working at local supermarket low wages
 Residing in a multiple family dwelling
 Social distancing not followed
 Became symptomatic the week of March 11



Case Study 2

Family in crisis:

- Mother of 5 children with 7 month old baby
- Non English speaking

- Known Engisis Speaking
 Economic hardship-one income household
 Multiple family dwelling
 Signs of intimate partner violence in the midst of COVID19
 Mother uses SMILE Facebook group to ask for coupons for infant formula
 Mother discloses father left family in midst of COVID19
