

David Luzzi, Ph.D, M.B.A, is Senior Vice Provost for Research of Northeastern University and Vice President for the Northeastern University Innovation Campus in Burlington, Massachusetts (ICBM).

Since arriving at the university in 2007 as Dean of the College of Engineering, David has dedicated himself to the success of the university and his Northeastern colleagues. He has contributed to many of the discussions, initiatives and actions that have transformed Northeastern University into a top-tier research university.
