Barbara Conley, MEd, BSN, RN

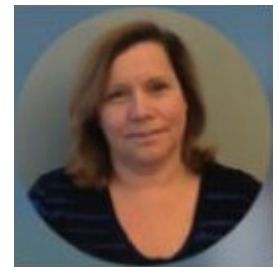
