What is a Drug?

Any substance that alters perception or behavior, reducing that individual's ability to function appropriately in the academic environment.

Seven Major Drug Categories

- Central Nervous System Depressants
- Central Nervous System Stimulants
- Hallucinogens
- Dissociative Anesthetics
- Narcotic Analgesics
- Inhalants
- Cannabis

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Methods of Ingestion

- Oral: Medication, Alcohol, edibles
- Snort: Powder Substances
- Smoke: Plant based, Cocaine/Crystal
- Inhalation: Solvents, Gases, Chasing the Dragon/Free Base
- Absorption: Transdermal Meds/Acid
- Injection: Medictions/heroin/Cocaine
- Insertion: Alcohol saturated items
- Vape: Very similar to Inhalation... But

Pharmacokinetics

•How a chemical substance is transported through the body in terms of absorption, distribution, metabolism, and elimination.



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Psychoactive Drugs

- •A chemical that alters brain/body function resulting in temporary changes in:
- · Perception
- Mood
- Consciousness
- Behavior



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Homeostasis

•Homeostasis is the dynamic balance, or steady state, involving levels of salts, water, sugars, and other materials in the body's fluids.

• The body's systems are said to be in "dynamic equilibrium"



Drug Matrix


• Recognize current drugs of abuse.

- Common pathways that substances are obtained.




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Powder Alcohol Est 2015...

• Released in 2015, Quickly became banned, but where there is a will there is a way...



Palcohol is powdered alcohol The federal government approved Palcohol on March 10, 2015 and it is now legal to be sold in the United States.

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Signs of Impairment

- · Glassy, Blood shot eyes
- Odor of "Alcoholic beverage on breath"
- · Slurred speech
- Fumbling fingers
- · Unsteady on feet
 - *When documenting alcohol related incidents, remember to state "Odor of an alcoholic beverage!"



Anti-Depressant Meds


- Klonopin; May cause drowsiness. When taken appropriately, it will help to control anxiety attacks.
- Prozac; Anti-anxiety, depression med. Rare side effect of violence.



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Most common CNS Depressant Drug found on the streets 2021

- Gabapentin (Neurontin)
- GABA/Gabbies
- Johnnies
 - Prescribed to treat nerve pain, and Alcohol & Cocaine withdrawals.
 - Causes a "Calm, euphoric high similar to marijuana"



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Marijuana



- Marijuana Bud/THC
- Potency can often be determined by odor, color, texture.



- Waxy Marijuana
- 82-99% THC
- One "hit" is the size of the tip of a pin.

New Cannabis Products

• Delta 8

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
• Three basic ways to make Delta 8, most common means is to synthesize it from CBD. Solvents and Strong acids are used.



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Signs of Impairment

- Red and Glassy eyes, dilated pupils (CaSH)
- Conjunctiva
- Odor of burnt marijuana

Cocaine

- Stimulant Class "B" Drug
- · Coke, blow, nose candy
- · White crystalline powder
- Snorted, dissolved into water and injected, sometime smoked, or rubbed onto soft tissue.

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Crack Cocaine Paraphernalia

- Glass pipes, thick gage glass tubes.
- Lighters
- Baking soda
- Water
- Spoon; look for charred resign



Signs of Impairment

- Dilated pupils (CaSH)
- · Red and Glassy eyes
- Sweating, dry mouth, flushed skin
- Tremors, Hyperactivity
- · Raised pulse
- Tense muscle tone



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Ritalin and Adderall

- Stimulant class medications, commonly found in school settings.
- Used to assisted ADHD.
- Potential of abuse. School staff reported one incident where two students were found to be snorting the pills in class.





Meth... Is it in Massachusetts?





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Crystal Meth

Common Street names:

- Shards
- GlassCookies
- "Tina" After Tina Turner, based on the fact that Meth will spin or "dance" when dropped into water. Many users will drop a shard into water to determine if it is good product vs. junk or bunk.

Interview with Andrew

- "Meth is a really cool drug, it is the only drug that can go from a solid, to a liquid, then a gas and return to a solid, all in a short time"
- "I like to party or party & Play" meaning that I will use T and G at the same time.

Crystal/Meth

Meth & Poly Drug

- · Speedballs:
 - Stimulant & Depressant
 - T&G or Meth and Fentanyl
- Meth users often take blood thinners...
 - Meth is an extreme stimulant, causing the vessels to constrict and the heart to race. Users take a blood thinner to help protect themselves from clots, heart attacks and "to make the high better.

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Heroin

- Narcotic
- Dope, Dirt, Brown, "H," Smack, Thunder, Big H, Nose Drops
- White/Brown/Gray powder substance
- Injected, Smoked, Snorted.

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Pill Factory



New mix of Heroin on streets, Known as Cheese Heroin

 Base drug is powder form heroin, with crushed
 Tylenol PM, which then becomes "Cheese Heroin" which was designed to be used by first time Heroin users, for a more comfortable experience.



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Signs of Impairment

- Pin point pupils
- Slowed pulse rate, pale in color
- · Decreased breathing
- Track marks, reddening of nostrils
- Unconsciousness
- · Flaccid muscle tone
- Sedated "On the Nod."




Before we leave opioids...

- HUGE uptick in other Opioid family abuse...
 - Purple Drank: Prescription cough medicine containing Promethzine-codeine products.
 - Street Name: Sizzurp, Lean, Texas Tea and Purple Sprite.
 - 2021: Law Enforcement Bulletin warning of false prescriptions for Codeine liquid medications.

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MDMA/MOLLY

- Crystal form
 - Pink
 - Off white
 - Also found in capsules





Psilocybin Mushrooms

- Psilocybin
 Mushrooms, also
 known as Shrooms,
 nuggets, psychedelic
 shrooms.
- Ingested by eating (taste like crap) possibly made into a shroom tea.



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Coricidin "Triple C" "Skittles"

- Coricidin HBP is the most popular
- Overdose results in seizures, comma, uncontrolled bleeding
- Most popular w/abusers due to having 30mg of DXM, where other cough and cold meds only have 10-20mg.
