Sandy Hook Promise

Youth Violence and Safety in Massachusetts

15.7% of high school students reported being **in a physical fight** one or more times during the 12 months before the survey.

6.5% of high school students had been threatened or injured with a weapon (e.g., gun, knife, or club) on school property during the 12 months before the survey.

Almost 16% of high school students were bullied on school property in the 12 months before the survey

STOP Grant Overview

- Federal funding from the DOJ Bureau of Justice Assistance
- Programming over three years intended to reach 75 schools in districts serving grades 6-12
- Builds on work accomplished during our previous STOP Grant which ran from 2018-2023
