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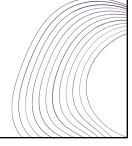

Over 30 states have some kind of mental health education policy in place

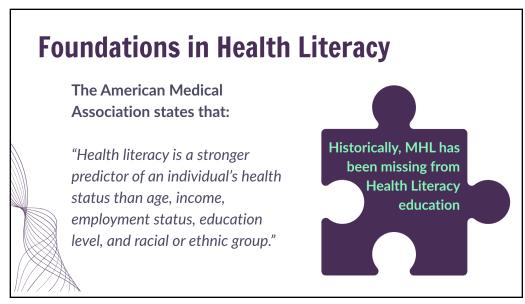
These states require K-12 mental health education: Delaware, Maine, Massachusetts, Nevada, New Jersey, New York, Rhode Island, and Vermont

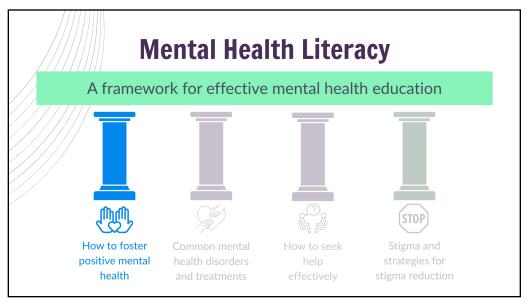
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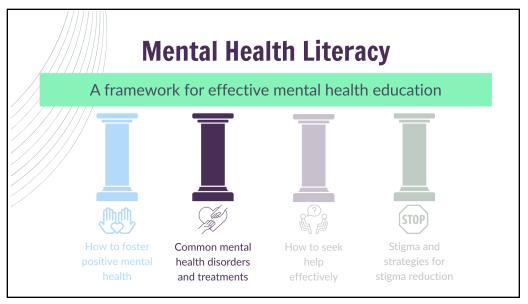


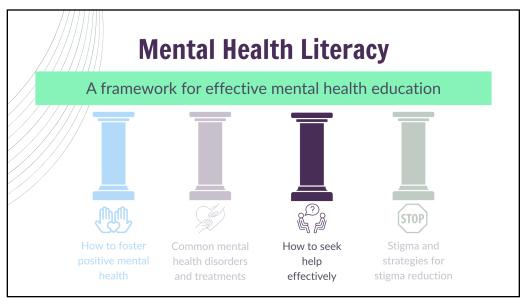


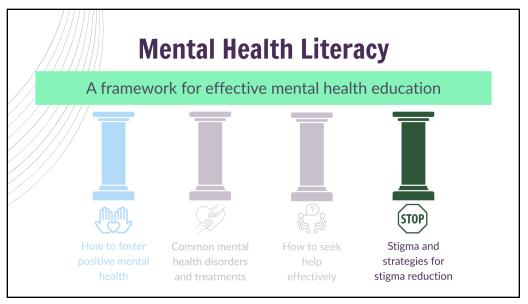

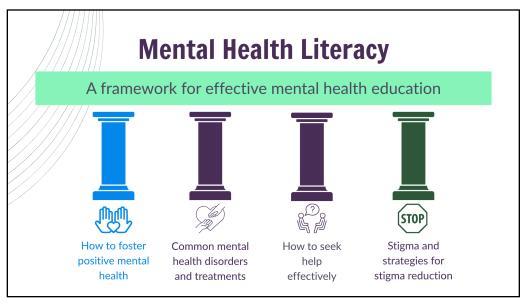


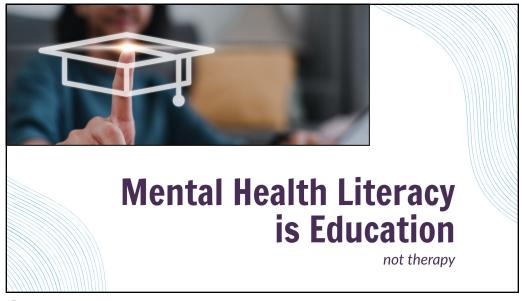


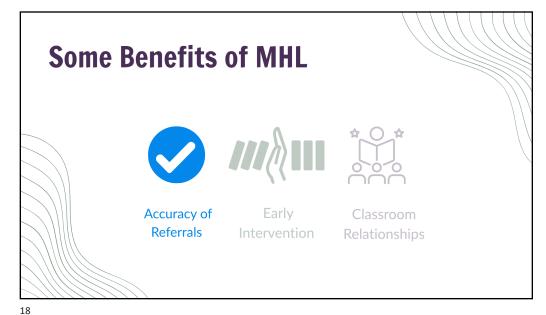


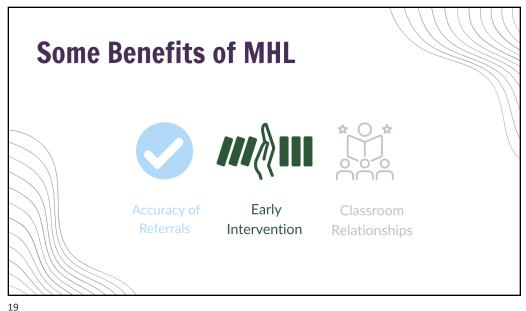


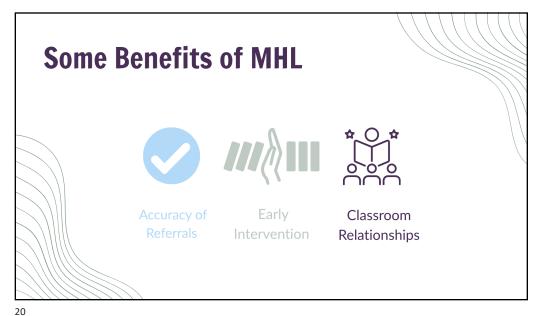












SEL Framework

- Develop healthy identities
- Manage emotions and achieve personal and collective goals
- Feel and show **empathy** for others
- Establish and maintain healthy, supportive relationships
- Make responsible and caring decisions

MHL Framework

- Understand how to foster and maintain positive mental health
- Understand common mental health disorders and treatments
- Understand **effective help-seeking** strategies for self and others
- Understand stigma and strategies for stigma reduction



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The Human Mind is Hungry

2 in 3 teens believe schools should teach about mental health (NAMI, 2022)

83-84% of TikTok videos tagged #mentalhealthtips or #mentalhealthadvice were found to be misleading or inaccurate

31% of Tik Tok videos contained outright false, harmful information about mental health (PlushCare, 2025)

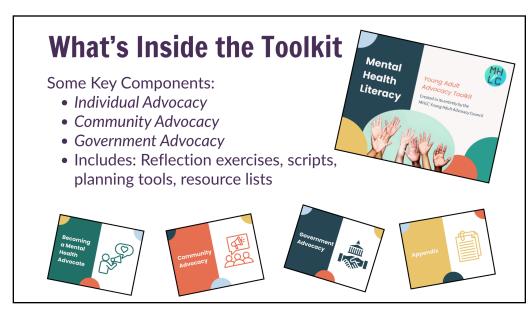
Young Adult MHL Advocacy Toolkit

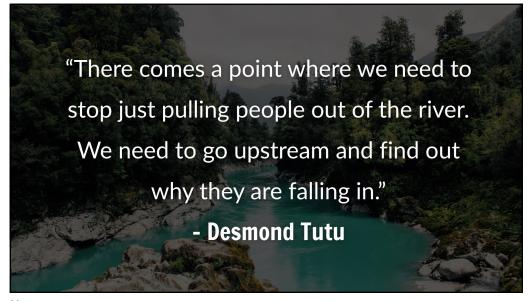

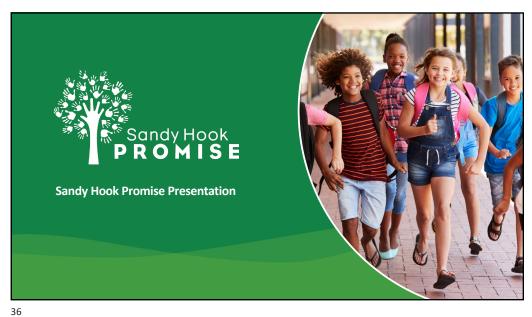

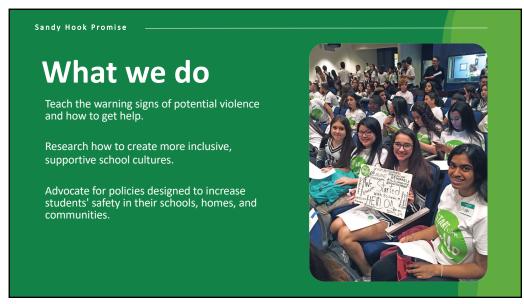


Our mission is to educate and empower youth and adults to prevent violence in schools, homes, and communities.

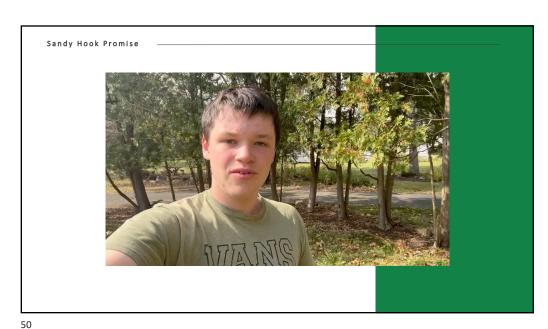

SAVE Promise Club

SAVE Promise Clubs are youth-led organizations that encourage young people to take charge of keeping their friends, schools, and communities safe. They offer a powerful approach to preventing violence because they recognize the unique role that young people play in making their schools and communities safer. A SAVE Promise Club can be a stand-alone club or embedded into an existing club, such as SADD, Student Council, FCCLA, or another student leadership, civic, or kindness club.

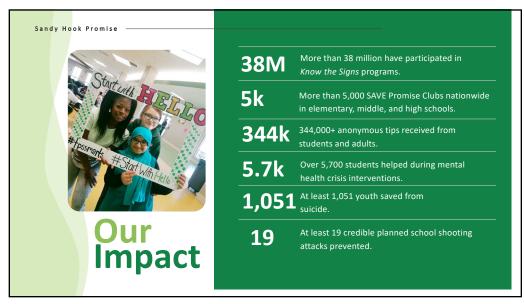
